

#### **NURSERY**

This week the nursery have been learning about the hungry caterpillar. We used our numeracy skills counting the pieces of fruit and we talked about healthy and unhealthy foods.



On Thursday we made orangeade in our cooking session. We squeezed oranges and measured the sugar and water. We then discussed the sugar dissolving in the water once it was heated in the saucepan.





We also had a visit from Mrs Purbrick and her beautiful lambs. We had lots of cuddles and learnt how to care for them.





















Today the theme for the session at Forest School was 'bees' as 20th May is World Bee Day, so far this term we've looked for ants, caterpillars and butterflies and today it was bees. The children have been playing buzzing games as well as sampling a delicious honey snack.









#### **RECEPTION**

The reception class continued with their RSPB challenge at Forest School. They planted a butterfly garden and created a bug home in a bucket buried in the ground. Mrs Price shared lots of butterfly facts and the children hunted for them in the woods. Lily brought cakes for a birthday snack, but the Hungry Caterpillars had a nibble.





















History came to life for Year 1 when Forest School was transformed into a Motte and Bailey castle. The children had to try and climb the 'motte' and make it to the fire-pit without being spotted. Mr Wardell was on the look-out for intruders and, if the attackers were noticed, they were sent to the dungeon to be guarded by Mrs Price. Entertainment was provided by various court jesters who were dancing and telling jokes. The was also a magical moment when the children were befriended by a butterfly.













Year 1 would like to say a big thank you to Kira's mummy for bringing two lambs to visit us. The children loved finding out how to keep the lambs healthy, mixing milk and feeding them. There was also plenty of time for cuddles!













Exmoor Zoo came for the morning, with some special friends, to visit and educate Year 1 and 2 about some amazing animals. We learnt so many interesting and fascinating facts about animals native to Africa, linking in with our topic this term. The children were so curious and impeccably behaved, taking care to be respectful and gentle with the animals. We all had a wonderful 'in-school' zoo experience.











#### YEAR 3

Year 3 have enjoyed learning about levers. They initially made moving projects with only 1 lever with teacher and support from friends to measure and attach with accuracy. The simple activity built the children's confidence and independently they have begun to make more complicated levers with 4 pivots.

The next stage will be creating a design criteria and planning a picture to educate younger children about plants, finally making and evaluating their own pictures.

We have really enjoyed Mrs Garrett teaching 3B Science and had a little party with ice lolly rockets to celebrate her time with us.











Whether you love it or loathe it, everyone has something to say about maths. For National Numeracy Day on 18<sup>th</sup> May, Year 4 took part in activities to support positive attitudes towards maths and we also participated in a world record attempt for a maths times tables live stream. We joined Primary Schools from all over the country and succeeded in breaking the Guinness World Record with over 5000 Schools participating at once! Well done Year 4!





In design and technology this term, Year 4 are making bug hotels. This week, we visited Forest school to collect items for these. We collected leaves, sticks, moss, feathers and more, which can all be used to make fabulous homes for the bugs.
