Wellington Nursery School offers term time provision with access to approximately six weeks of Welly Boot Club, which is our holiday club care. The Nursery School term time dates are published on the School website and in each term's Prep School diary.

The Nursery School operates on a sessional basis and the charges are:

£51.25 per day (this consists of two sessions and runs from 8am to 6pm);

Or £29.50 per session (either morning, which runs from 8am to 1pm, or afternoon, which runs from 1pm to 6pm).

Please note that meals, snacks and our 'Learning for Life' Enrichment Programme are included in this charge.

## Early Years Entitlement funding (EYE)

The School is registered with Somerset Local Authority to receive EYE funding.

We offer 15 hours' entitlement to all parents of 3 and 4 year olds; the 'universal entitlement'.

We also offer 30 hours' entitlement (the 'extended entitlement') to those working parents who are eligible.

For children receiving EYE funding the following numbers of hours are available:

15 Hours per week of Early Year Entitlement = 570 hours per year

30 Hours per week of Early Years Entitlement = 1140 hours per year

The School currently receives £4.18 per hour from the local authority for claimed hours.

- £29.50 per session (either am or pm) with Early Years Funding means you will pay £8.60
- £51.25 per day with Early Years Funding means you will pay £9.45.

*Please note the Nursery School only accepts EYE funding during our school term times (please see above). EYE funding cannot be used for Welly Boot Holiday Club but childcare vouchers can be used.*

The Early Years Entitlement is intended to cover the cost of delivering up to 30 hours a week of free, high quality, flexible childcare. It does not cover the cost of meals and snacks, consumables, additional hours, trips and visits, or our Educational Enrichment Programme, which includes a range of activities such as Balanceability, Forest School, computing and music. Where Early Years Entitlement is being claimed, a modest additional charge is made to cover this shortfall.

EYE is allocated on an annual basis in line with the academic year. Once EYE funding has been exhausted for an academic year, the fees as outlined above will apply.

We do not charge for days when the Nursery School is closed. However, please note that the Nursery School is open on the first Bank Holiday in May, as this is a normal opening day for the School.

Fees are payable on all contracted sessions, irrespective of whether your child is in attendance.

**For parents to claim EYE, the following information is required by Wellington School Accounts department:**

- ✓ A copy of a child's legal documentation – birth certificate, passport (on registration, a copy needs to be sent to the Entitlements team);
- ✓ EYE parent declaration form – completed when appropriate and signed by the parent;
- ✓ Eligibility code from registered parent (HMRC);
- ✓ Details of the parent's National Insurance number will also be required to access the funding on the parent's behalf. If permission is not granted we are unable to accept additional EYE funding.

For the extended entitlement, 30 hours per week are offered during Wellington School term time. For the universal entitlement, 15 hours per week are offered during Wellington School term time. Wellington School term times typically account for 35 weeks of the year. The School does not provide a 'stretched offer' in any form.

If your child attends another setting, in addition to Wellington Nursery School, you can split the hourly entitlement funding. If your child is using additional settings, it is the parent's responsibility to ensure that they do not over-claim their EYE funding. Somerset County Council will reclaim any overpayments from the provider of their choice. The School will then reclaim any losses directly from parents.

While the Nursery School accepts children once they are three years old, EYE funding starts at *the beginning of the term following the child's third birthday*. The relevant dates are:

- Children born in the period from 1<sup>st</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> March: the start of term beginning on or following 1<sup>st</sup> April after the child's third birthday
- Children born in the period from 1<sup>st</sup> April to 31<sup>st</sup> August: the start of term beginning on or following 1<sup>st</sup> September after the child's third birthday
- Children born in the period from 1<sup>st</sup> September to 31<sup>st</sup> December: the start of term beginning on or following 1<sup>st</sup> January after the child's third birthday
