# Our curriculum is unique.


While we use the National Curriculum as a starting point, we have developed an enhanced curriculum that challenges, inspires and engages our children.

Traditional skills, such as handwriting and learning times tables, sit alongside the higher order thinking required to develop problem solving skills and creativity. By articulating ideas, children are encouraged to think for themselves by questioning, discussing and analysing.

The concept of being immersed in learning runs throughout WPS. From Forest School, which starts in the Early Years, to the experiential approaches used to solve the most complicated of problems, children are engaged in their learning. Learning is not a spectator sport.

As children progress through WPS, they benefit from more and more subject specialist teaching, which begins in Nursery. Once children reach the Prep Years, they enjoy specialist teaching from Prep and Senior School teachers, providing rich seams of expertise and easing the children's transition to the Senior School.

As a relatively young Prep School, we benefit from purpose built structures and spaces. We also enjoy sharing the superb facilities of the Senior School; facilities that facilitate and inspire our children's success.





### The Co-curriculum

Children learn as much outside the classroom as they do inside. The breadth of opportunities to shine through our co-curriculum helps to ensure that each child grows in self-belief, confidence and momentum. However, one of the most significant benefits of the 'other half' of school life is that it enhances what happens in the classroom.

Sport and wellbeing, music, drama and art are integral parts of school life and the lives of our children. These activities provide children with the time and space to develop and refine new skills, express themselves, understand the importance of practice and appreciate the significance of playing one's part in a team.

We are busy but, more importantly, we are purposeful. As the school gate opens at 8am, and at the end of the teaching day, the majority of children stay on for clubs after school. The opportunities offered vary, but include sporting, musical, crafting and enrichment activities.

Many of life's most important lessons are just as likely to be learned on the playing field or the stage as in the classroom.
